

Andrew Fritz Is Dead After Brief Illness

Former Deputy State
Treasurer, Examiner
Had Long Career.

Andrew E. Fritz, of the Fritz-Cross company, state public examiner for 12 years, and deputy state treasurer until two years ago, died at 1 o'clock Wednesday at the Samaritan hospital in St. Paul. He had been ill for two months.

Mr. Fritz was born in St. Cloud on January 28, 1870, a son of Andrew and Mary (Braun) Fritz. He attended the local schools and was graduated in 1891 from the St. Cloud normal school. He taught for a while, serving as superintendent of schools in Ottertail county from 1898 to 1901. In 1911 he became public examiner.

Had Practiced Law

Mr. Fritz practiced law for a time in St. Paul with Charles S. Foster. At the time of his death he was occupied for the most part in the operation of the Fritz-Cross chair factory.

Mrs. Fritz, who was Harriet Moran, survives with one daughter, Harriet.

Mrs. Xavier Honer of this city, is a sister of Mr. Fritz; and Mrs. Frank Klein, who lives near Hammond, Indiana. Surviving brothers are Albert in Fargo, William in Mitchell, S. D., and Rudolph in St. Joseph, Missouri.

Mr. Fritz was a member of the St. Cloud lodge of Elks. His home address was 127 North Lexington avenue, St. Paul.

The funeral will be held at 9 o'clock Saturday morning at St. Luke's church in St. Paul and burial made in Calvary cemetery. The body is at the O'Halloran and Murphy funeral home in St. Paul where friends may call.
