Andrew E. Fritz, former deputy state treasurer and chief public examiner, died last week in St. Paul after an illness of several months. He was known to many in this community. He began his service to the state in 1911, being chief public examiner until 1921, when he resigned to practice law in St. Paul. In 1930 he was appointed deputy state treasurer by Julius A. Schmahl, serving in this office until 1937, when he again went back to his law practice. He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Harriet Moran of Mantorville, and one daughter, Miss Harriet Fritz, of St. Paul.
