FARMER DIES SUDDENLY

Herman Fischer Drops Dead at His Home in Mayhew Lake Without Warning

COMPLAINED OF SHORTNESS OF BREATH

Found Relef in the Fresh Air But Died Shortly After Returning to flouse

Herman Fischer, aged about 60 years and for many years a prominent farmer of Mayhew Lake, Benton county, dropped idead yesterday afternoon, presumably from an attack of heart disease.

He had been in his usual good health, but just before noon complained of being short of breath. He stepped from the house into the fresh air, and upon his return appeared to be relieved. He got up from a chair to look after the fire and after attending to that duty, fell to the floor as he walked toward his chair. Members of the family were immediatey at his side, but he died within a few minutes. A wife and a grown son are the surviving members of the family. Among the other relatives are four cousins, living in St. Cloud, Mrs. Edward Doerner, Mrs. Will Ernst, Mrs. Andrew Fritz and Mrs. Julia Kuck.
