
COLD SPRING — The senior class of St. Boniface high school, under the direction of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Harris, are producing the popular musical by Rodgers and Hammerstein, "The Sound of Music." It features a cast of fifty plus a twenty-three piece pit band performing the original Broadway score. The student director is Kathy Wittrock of Watkins, and the student musical director is Bede Willenbring, Cold Spring. Performances are on April 30, May 1 and 2 at 8 p.m.; and a matinee on May 1 at 1:30 p.m.

Heading the cast are Judy Asfeld (Watkins) as Maria, the music loving postulant; and Steve Don-

nay (Cold Spring) as Captain Von Trapp. The movie version of "Sound of Music" was a winner of five Academy awards in this year's selections. It is a play of uncommon distinction and charm, a production formed with obvious taste and affection around a narrative that is at once warmly amusing and full of meaning. The tremendous success of this musical can best be measured from a quotation from *Variety*, a journal not famed for sentimental notices: "an absorbing book, an outstanding score, a superlative blend of enchantment and drama . . ." thus, "The Sound of Music."
