

# Cameron Victorious by Overwhelming Majority In City Mayoralty Race

**Leo Landwehr Elected Councilman for First Ward and C. H. Brewer Defeats Marken by 8 Votes in Third Ward**

A new mayor and two new city councilmen will take office here on May 5 as Monday's election gave D. S. Cameron an overwhelming majority in the three-cornered mayoralty race and Leo Landwehr was elected councilman from the first ward and C. H. Brewer to the council from the third ward, defeating Incumbent Otto G. Marken by eight votes.

The vote for Cameron was virtually a landslide, as the successful candidate polled six votes more than

double the total number of votes cast for the other two candidates, Robert Pauline and Incumbent F. O. Williams.

Peter P. Webberg was re-elected as city treasurer over Mrs. Opal Fehlberg and H. L. Lokensgard, unopposed for police judge, was given a large vote of confidence.

In ward two, A. E. Anderson and E. J. Falkner were returned to the city council and in ward one, W. A. Ryder was re-elected to the council with Landwehr replacing D. S. Cameron. Ryder and Landwehr received identical votes, 325 each. In the third ward Dr. V. W. Sundellus was returned to the council, with newly-elected C. H. Brewer.

A total of 1,712 votes, or about 46 per cent of the registered voters of the city, were cast in yesterday's election. Wards two and three cast 46.9 per cent of their total registered votes and ward one cast 44.2 per cent of its total.
