

J. G. Landwehr Dies; Rosary Monday Night

Jerome G. Landwehr, 46, who had resided at 78 Third Ave. W.N., passed away in Kalispell Friday.

Mr. Landwehr was born Feb. 21, 1920, at Elbowoods, N. D. He attended elementary school in North Dakota and in 1936 came to Kalispell where he completed his education, graduating from Flathead High School in 1938. He has been a resident of Kalispell since that time with the exception of the years spent in the armed forces.

On Jan. 3, 1944, he enlisted in the U. S. Army at Butte. He had served in the 746 Railway Operating Battalion 2nd, served 14 months in the European Theater of Operations before receiving his honorable discharge May 20, 1946, at Camp McCoy, Wis. Mr. Landwehr had been employed as assistant manager of the Pacific Hide and Fur Co. at the time of his death. He had been employed by the firm for the past 16 years. He was a member of the St. Matthew's Catholic Church of Kalispell and the Elks Lodge of Kalispell. He was married to Ellen Joyce Buck who preceded him in death in August of 1962.

He is now survived by three sons, Robert D., James F., and Thomas S. Landwehr; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Landwehr; two brothers, Vincent G. and Leonard L. Landwehr; and two sisters, Mrs. William (Eleanor) Hedstrom and Mrs. Dolores Lampman, all of Kalispell.

Rosary for Mr. Landwehr will be recited in the Johnson Chapel at 8 p.m. Monday. Requiem high mass will be celebrated in St. Matthew's Catholic Church at 9 a.m. Tuesday with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Michael J. Halligan as celebrant. Interment will be in the Glacier Memorial Gardens Cemetery with military graveside rites being conducted by the local veterans organizations.
