Funeral services for Ellen Joyce Landwehr were conducted Monday afternoon from Christ Episcopal church, Rev. Thomas Best officiating. Interment followed in the Conrad Memorial Cemetery under the direction of the Waggener and Campbell Funeral Home.

Mrs. Landwehr was enroute to Kamloops on a vacation when she was stricken in Calgary with food poisoning. She was taken to the Calgary General Hospital where an artificial kidney was applied, but succumbed to uremic poisoning after a three week illness last Wednesday at the age of 32 years.

Ellen Joyce Landwehr was born Oct. 11, 1929, in Kalispell. She had made her home here most of her life time with the exception of a time spent in Great Falls, where she attended school. She had also attended grade schools in Kalispell, and Flathead County High School.

Surviving Mrs. Landwehr are her three sons, Robert David, James Frank, and Thomas Sidney, all of Kalispell; her mother and stepfather, Mr. and Mrs. Dave Bright of Kalispell; two brothers, Fred S. Buck of Chicago, Ill., and Lt. Harold Archibald who last week returned from duty in Germany and is now in Kalispell; one sister, Teresa Archibald of Kalispell; and her aunt, Mrs. Archie A. O'Claire of Kalispell.
