

A. H. LANDWEHR DIES IN DAKOTA

**Former St. Cloud Resident
Died in Bismarck Hospital,
N. D., Yesterday.**

The death of A. H. Landwehr of Elbow Lake, N. D., a former resident of this city occurred yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock at the Bismarck hospital following an operation. The deceased had been a patient in the hospital for the past five months.

Mr. Landwehr was born in St. Augusta and spent most of his younger days in that township. Prior to going to North Dakota he lived in St. Cloud for a number of years. He was 61 years of age.

He is survived by his wife and ten children. They are George, Mrs. Whittrach and Mrs. Reinbold of Mankato, Minn., Joseph and Florintine, at Sidney, Montana; and Robert, Leo, Arthur Olivia and Regina all at home at Elbow Lake. Besides his wife and children he has four brothers, W. H. Landwehr, of this city, Barney of St. Augusta, Henry of Portland, Oregon and J. F. Landwehr, of Sedan, Minn., and one half sister, Mrs. Kiffmeyer of Clear Lake and his mother, Mrs. Henry Landwehr, who is now 93 years old.

The definite funeral arrangements have not been made but the remains will arrive in St. Cloud on Sunday morning and be taken to the home of his brother, W. H. Landwehr at 901 12th avenue south.
