

MRS. B. LANDWEHR COUNTY PIONEER, DIES YESTERDAY

Was Resident of St. Augusta
All Her Life — Leaves
Eight Children.

NATIVE RESIDENT

Funeral Services to Be at St.
Augusta Church on Fri-
day Morning.

One of Stearns county's most noteworthy pioneers, and St. Augusta's oldest resident, Mrs. Barney Landwehr, died last evening at 10:5 o'clock at the family homestead, near St. Augusta, after an illness which was caused by advanced years.

Mrs. Landwehr was 70 years old.

She had made her home on the Landwehr farm after her marriage, which occurred 48 years ago.

Mrs. Landwehr was born in the town where she spent all her life, and was familiar with many of the pioneer events in that locality. She is a member of one of the largest relationships in the county, but was also known through a large circle of friends who will regret to hear of her death.

The funeral services will be held at St. Augusta Catholic church, of which she and her husband were pioneer members, on Friday morning at 9:30 o'clock, and burial will be made in the family lot of cemetery there. Rev. James Walcher will officiate.

With Mr. Landwehr there are eight surviving children. They are Mrs. George Goettle, Bonnybrook, N. D.; Mrs. Joseph Klaverkamp, Mrs. Hubert Klaverkamp, and Miss Anna Landwehr, St. Augusta; August Landwehr, Minden; John Landwehr, Rockville; Clemens Landwehr, Minden, and Lawrence Landwehr, St. Cloud.
