

# BROTHERS MEET FOR FIRST TIME

## Youth Did Not Know Kin Existed Until 2 Weeks Ago.

A 21-year-old man will arrive late this afternoon from his home in Sudan, Pope county, Minn., to see his brother, a Duluthian, whom he did not know existed until about two weeks ago.

He is Gene Landwehers, a native of Virginia. The Duluthian is Stanley Jimnak, 35, of 1511 Belmont road.

Mr. Jimnak, also a native of Virginia, knew that he had a younger brother and since learning that Gene had reached his majority, sought to locate him.

The two boys became separated when the younger one was 3 years old. Their parents were stricken by the influenza epidemic which swept the country in 1918 and died 24 hours apart. Stanley moved to Duluth. Gene was cared for at the St. James orphanage here for a time and then was adopted by the Landwehers family. That was 18 years ago and the two brothers have not seen each other since.

Learning the whereabouts of Gene, Stanley recently communicated with him and asked that he join him here for a visit. The two long-lost brothers will be reunited when the train arrives at 6 p. m. today.
