

Good Fellows Fund Goes To \$1,068 Mark--Farmers Vote to Contribute \$218

**43 Farmers Who Sell Milk to Quality Dairy Join Plan,
Donating 109 Milk Coupon Books Worth \$2.00 Each
—Bellas Hess Store to Provide Baskets.**

The Good Fellows fund reached a total of \$1,068.00 today when President Adolph Landwehr of the Quality Dairy company brought in a check for \$145.00, which represented the contribution of \$5.00 each from 29 milk wagon drivers and other employees of the company, and \$218 from 43 farmers who sell milk at the dairy.

This was a splendid boost and the Good Fellows hope that the example set by the milk wagon drivers and others and the dairy farmers will be followed by other individuals. In order that each of the employees might give a gift of \$5.00 this year the company increased its total Christmas gifts to \$145.00. Because of the fact that many men and women do not have steady jobs at the present time there will be plenty of places to spend this money wisely. The money will be turned over to the general unemployment committee which is maintaining headquarters at the Salvation Army building. When the farmers who sell milk to the Quality Dairy company learned of what the employees were doing they also offered to make a substantial contribution to the Good Fellows.

As a result of a meeting held yesterday afternoon by the dairy men who supply milk and cream it was decided to purchase 109 \$2.00 milk coupon books.

July Wheat Drops To 1901 Low Mark

Chicago, Dec. 17. (UP)—July wheat fell to 68 to 68½ cents as the Board of Trade opened this morning, the lowest levels since 1901. Old crop deliveries were unevenly steady to higher, farm board buying advancing December sharply in the face of the weakness in July and the declines in foreign markets.
