EDWARD DOERNER LOCAL PIONEER DIES YESTERDAY

Death Occurs at Home Last Evening—Came Here in 1860.

The death of Edward Doerner, aged 74 years, prominent pioneer of this city, who came here in 1860, occurred at his home last evening at 9:10 o'clock after a long illness. Death was caus-ed by complications. Mr. Doerner had been in ill health for the past year.

Born in Sedelia, Mo., 1851, Mr. Doerner came to Minnesota with his parents in 1860. They settled in St. Cloud where with the exception of three years spent at Clear Lake, Mr. Doern-

er made his home here since. The pioneer engaged in the teaching profession which he followed for many years. After his retirement he opened a grocery store in Clear Lake in 1906, but returned to St. Cloud in 1909. Mr. Doerner was married in 1878.

Besides his widow, the pioneer leaves eight children: Mrs. P. J. Zierden of Waite Park; Mrs. C. L. Fuller, Isabel, S. D.; Victor A. Doerner, Santa Barbara, Cal.; and Mrs. Frank Hunstiger, Frank J. Doerner, Anna B. Doerner, Carl A. Doerner, and Mrs. A. F. Huss of this city. Three children, Francia Edward L. and an infent child cis. Edward L., and an infant child preceded their father in death.

The remains are being held at the Doerner home, 109 Fifteenth avenue south, until funeral services are held at St. Mary's church of which the pioneer was a member of the major

portion of his life.

Mass requiem will be said at St.
Mary's church at nine o'clock tomorrow morning. The remains will be
held at the Doerner home, however,
until Sunday afternoon at two o'clock when funeral services will take place at St. Mary's church. Burial will take place in the Doerner lot in Calvary cemetery.

Members of the St. Joseph society of which Mr. Doerner was a member for many years will attend the funeral service. The nephews of the pioneer will be his pallbearers.
