Miss Frances Doerner and Guy Peterson Are Drowned at Noon Today.

Were Rowing—Boat Capsized—People On Shore are Helpless to Aid Them.

Miss Frances Doerner and a young man named Guy Peterson were drowned at noon today in the lake near Clear Lake. Miss Frances Doerner is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Doerner formerly of this city but now living at Clear Lake. Miss Doerner is now living at Fargo where she is employed in the offices of Wheelock & Wheelock, as an office assistant. Miss Doerner previously

filled a like position for several years

with the A. G. Whitney Land Company in this city. She came to Clear Lake a few days ago from Chicago being away on a month's vacation.

This morning Miss Doerner and Mr. Peterson who runs a lumber yard at Clear Lake went out boating. They were about half a mile from shore when people watching them saw Miss Doerner pitch backwards out of the boat. In attempting to rescue her the boat was upset and Peterson also drowned. Up to this time the bodies have not been recovered.

Miss Doerner is a sister of Mrs. Peter Zierten and Mrs. Frank Hunstiger of this city.
