

## Funeral of Mrs. Julius Cook, at St. Mary's Monday

Mrs. Julius Cook, of St. Paul, a former resident of St. Cloud for many years, died Thursday evening, March 4, at eight o'clock, at her home in St. Paul, 100 Cleveland avenue. She was 74 years of age last Nov. 11. Her death was due to complications, following a lingering illness.

Mrs. Cook, formerly Elizabeth Braun was born in Jefferson City, Missouri and came to this city at an early age with her parents, who lived on a farm south of St. Cloud, about two miles. She made her home here, until 15 years ago, when she removed to St. Paul. Her husband died several years ago.

Nine children survive. They are: Rudd, of St. Paul; Frank, of Ritzville, Washington; Dora, of St. Paul; Edward, of Melrose; Leo, St. Paul; Mrs. Otto Dirkes, of Spokane, Washington; Albert, of Duluth; Sister Jane, O. S. B., teacher at St. Benedict's Academy; Isabel, of St. Paul.

Mrs. Edward Doerner, of St. Cloud, a sister, J. P. Braun, a brother, and Mrs. William Ernst, another sister, of this city, also, remain.

Frank Cook, of Ritzville, Wash., is unable to arrive from the West. Mrs. Dirkes will reach St. Cloud Sunday from Spokane. All of the other children were at the death bed.

Mrs. Cook will be brought to the J. P. Braun home at 302 Seventh avenue south, late this afternoon and the funeral will be held at the St. Mary's church Monday morning, at nine o'clock. Six nephews will act as pallbearers.
